The Mexican asparagus market is weak, but harvesting is on the rise in Baja and Caborca. Peruvian asparagus stock is tight, but the quality is very good. Asparagus stalks are straight, and the tips are tight. **TOMATOES**

While tomato demand is weak, the



quality of the produce remains high, and prices are stable. Consistent production levels are expected to continue in Florida until mid-March. After that, spring crops will be harvested, leading to a significant increase in tomato supply. **POTATOES** Northwest Norkotah potatoes will continue to be available until late April, after which Burbank potatoes will be the only variety in the market for the remainder of the season. While the Norkotah supplies are still available,
