




MARKET UPDATES Heavy rain affects harvests for some essential items, leading to limited supplies. Growing region transitions are also contributing to temporary supply shortages.



Lower yields due to yellowing lead to tighter

supplies, and growers are working to meet

demand despite these challenges.

Navel oranges are peaking in sizes

with suppliers prorating up to 50%.

California Valencia oranges are expected

continue with the supply of sizes 113/138cts,

to start by mid-to-late April. Challenges

TOMATOES The tomato market remains on alert due to ongoing rainfall in Florida and early season wrap-up in Mexico, which is impacting round tomatoes. Grape and cherry varieties have improved, with increased supply meeting normal demand, while hothouse Campari and medley tomatoes remain extremely tight, with demand outpacing supply.
