





## October brings major harvest transitions across the U.S., with California's Salinas Valley nearing the end of its season and growers preparing to move south into the Arizona/California

desert region by early November. The ongoing heat, humidity,

and insect pressure continues to challenge yields in lettuce, romaine, broccoli, and cauliflower. For the time being, expect increased pricing until desert production stabilizes. Hurricane Priscilla in Mexico caused temporary shipping disruptions and minor quality issues in berries, limes, and some peppers. East Coast areas are stable with ample supplies of bell peppers, cucumbers, zucchini, and corn. Newcrop apples and pears from Washington and Michigan show excellent color and sugar levels. Grapes remain in great

condition, although California's season will wind down soon.


